# GOLDEN JUBILEE EXHIBITION

*3 April – 1 May 2010*

*Guildford House Gallery, High Street, Guildford*

Open to all members of SPA affiliated clubs

The Exhibition has received PAGB patronage under Certificate No. 05/2010.

The following awards will be made:

- A **trophy** (to be held for two years) and **PAGB gold medals** to the best in each of the seven entry classes
- PAGB ribbons to each Selector's choice in each of the seven classes
- SPA ribbons to highly commended
- SPA certificates to commended

The trophies will be presented at a **Golden Jubilee Dinner** on **16 April 2010**. Other awards will be distributed through the clubs.

### CLASSES OF ENTRY

For the first time there will be two projected digital classes, Open and Nature. Classes for prints and slides will continue as previously, namely (in prints) Monochrome, Colour and Nature, and in slides, Open and Nature.

Although the exhibition is selective, each club is guaranteed at least one acceptance from the images submitted by its members. There will be no catalogue but details of the accepted entries will be posted on the SPA website, together with a selection of the award-winning images.

All clubs will receive a CD with a selection of the accepted digital and slide images.

The main ones to note are detailed below.

#### Digital entries

Entries will not be accepted unless they comply **EXACTLY** with the stipulated format, and it is imperative that the the title and photographer's name do not appear in the image space.

**Slide entries**

Slides must be original film captured images - slides which originated as digitally captured images that have subsequently been converted to slides are no longer acceptable in the slide classes.

**Print entries**

All prints must mounted on card of a standard size of 50cm x 40cm. Any print entry that does not conform to this standard will not be considered for acceptance. Monochrome prints are defined as including black and white images that have been modified by the addition of a single colour applied to the WHOLE print – partially coloured prints fall into the colour class.
